WHAT IS A SAFE PLACE?

A Safe Place is a place for people of diverse backgrounds and identities to gather in community with one another. In this case, our aim, in conjunction with the Orange County Sheriff's Office, is to create a place where people in the LGBTQ Community feel welcomed and accepted. For the library, this means bringing our policy of safety and inclusion out of the fine print and into the bold print. We created this guide to assist victims of a bias crime find the resources they need in an emergency situation.

WHAT IS A BIAS CRIME?

As defined by the Orange County Sheriff's Office, a bias crime is a criminal act committed due to bigotry toward the victim's identity of lifestyle.

A bias incident falls under three categories:

- 1) Malicious Harassment—the reason the suspect targeted the victim was based on the suspect's belief about the victim's identity
- 2) Crimes with Bias Elements—during the commission of any crime, bias comments were made
- 3) Non-Criminal Bias Incidents—offensive or derogatory language that may fall under the category of free speech

According to Florida law, every citizen is a mandated reporter, which means that if you suspect a person to be the victim of abuse or neglect, you are obligated to report this to law enforcement.
